

DECEMBER SELECTION: *The Nickel Boys* by Colson Whitehead is a heart-wrenching story about Elwood Curtis, a black boy growing up in the 1960s in Tallahassee, Florida and who is unfairly sentenced to a juvenile reformatory called the Nickel Academy. “He finds himself trapped in a grotesque chamber of horrors. His only salvation is his friendship with a fellow “delinquent” Turner who thinks Elwood is extremely naïve. Turner believes the world is crooked and the only way to survive is to scheme and avoid trouble.” It is based on the real story of a reform school that operated for 111 years and warped the lives of thousands of children. Author Whitehead’s “The Nickel Boys” is a devastating, driven narrative that shows what a great American novelist he is. His first book “The Underground Railroad” won the Pulitzer.

TWO “NEW” ADDITIONS TO OUR LIBRARY

Mary D’Amico has not deserted us in her heart – even though she is now based in The Villages, FL. During her last visit, Mary brought us a number of books, most importantly, “Pollyanna” and “Beyond Broadway.”

“Pollyanna,” written by Eleanor H. Porter, was first published in 1913 with the dedication “To My Cousin Belle.” This Belle is better known to us as Mrs. Frank Henry Knight, the first President of The Woman’s Club of White Plains. It soon became a classic of children’s literature and led to the new term “Pollyanna” in American English meaning an excessively cheerful or optimistic person. The book is still in print and ultimately led to a well-known movie in 1960 as well as a sequel book. Frankly, it sounds like a book each of us might benefit from reading in this less than optimistic time!

The second book, “Beyond Broadway” by Julian Olney, gives the fascinating history of live theatre in Westchester. Much of the book is inspired by the work of Dorothy McGrayne Olney, the producer of works at the Ridgeway Theatre in the Contemporary Club during the 1930’s and ‘40’s. For those of you who don’t recognize it, this is our very own Ballroom! It became “sort of a Mecca for the county residents, a playhouse hidden away off a winding road that curves through the hills of Westchester.” Much of the book takes place there and there are fascinating descriptions of how the theatre was run, try-outs held there and plays being tested for Broadway. It is fun reading for anyone with an interest in live theatre.

These books will be kept in the Library at the Club.

Many thanks again to **Mary D’Amico** for her energetic sleuthing!

MEMORABLE RECIPES

Back in the early 1960's and 1970's there was a Junior Section of the White Plains Woman's Club whose bylaws stated that you could only be a member of this section until you turned 35!!! I was a member then and served on the committee who published a cookbook as a philanthropy fundraiser entitled "Try It---You'll Like It" published in 1972. Hope you enjoy these recipes.

PATTY'S HOT CRAB DIP

1 pkg. frozen crab meat (thaw and squeeze out liquid – discard liquid and pull apart the crab meat in to string like pieces)

1 8oz. pkg. of cream cheese

3 TBSP. mayonnaise

1tsp. garlic salt

2 dashes of tabasco

Mix together and put in a corning ware dish. Bake 350 degrees for 30 minutes. To serve, spread on crackers.

FRENCH ONION SOUP

2 large white onions, sliced

1 large red onion sliced

2 TBSP. butter 1 TBSP olive oil

1 TBSP flour

6 cups water

7 packets of MBT chicken broth

¼ to ½ cup of dry sherry

Brown onions gently in butter. Add olive oil and stir in flour. Then add water and chicken broth packets. Simmer 20 to 30 minutes. Add sherry and salt and pepper to taste.

Cut Italian bread in pieces and toast in oven. Put into separate bowls and pour onion soup over. Top each bowl with Swiss cheese. Put under broiler for 5 minutes, until brown. Serves 4-6 depending on size of the bowl.

¼ tsp curry
1 can French fried onion rings

Place cooked broccoli in a baking dish. Mix together soup, mayo, curry and ¾ of a can of French fried onion rings. Pour over broccoli. Bake for 35 minutes at 350 degrees. Sprinkle remainder of onion rings on top just before removing from oven.




