

## WHITE PLAINS ALMANAC

My husband and I are relative newcomers to White Plains, moving here from Hastings-on-Hudson nine years ago when we became empty nesters. What I have grown to love about our “new” home is its combination of a city’s vibrancy and the congeniality of a smaller town. I have become curious about White Plains’ past and hope over the next few months to share a glimpse with fellow members of the Women’s Club of both the ways in which White Plains has changed over the years and what echoes still resonate from the past.

Until the late 17th Century, White Plains was home to members of the Weckquaeskeck tribe who are described by some historians as a part of the larger Wappinger tribal group and by others as part of the Mohican nation, two related but distinct tribes, whose members merged only after the arrival of Europeans and the resultant decimation of the members of both tribes, due to exposure to European diseases and bloody conflicts with European settlers.

Scholars agree that until the late 17th century, White Plains was exclusively the home of members of the Weckquaeskeck tribe who called their home Quarropos, which is translated to mean “white marshes” or “plains of white.” Apparently the name was chosen because during their time here, there were still numerous wetlands over which hovered heavy white mists. Although most of the wetlands are gone, our town’s name is still a rough translation of the name given to it by our Weckquaeskeck forbears and Quarropos is the name of one of our major downtown avenues. In addition, although I have not witnessed it, many locals report that white mists still often hover over the tip of our downtown skyscrapers.

On November 22, 1683, a group of inhabitants of Rye bought 4,435 acres of land, constituting the whole of Quarropos, from 18 Sachem, or tribal chiefs. The sale took place next to a lake where the Westchester mall now stands. In fact, on the second retail level of the mall, you can see a commemorative plaque with a bust of Chief Orawaupum, one of the signers of the treaty consummating the sale.

While it is believed that native peoples, including the Weckquaeskeck had lived in Westchester for 3,000 years, the life of the Weckquaeskeck, once the European settlers arrived in Westchester was both short lived and tragic. In fact, much of the information we gleaned from colonial reports about the local tribe's social and political organization has recently been called into question since the widespread annihilation of the tribe preceded many of those reports, destroying the Weckquaeskeck's political and social organization and leaving few native persons to confirm or modify the colonists' conclusions. For example, although until recently it was assumed that the Weckquaeskeck were fulltime farmers and fishermen who lived yearlong in White Plains, we don't know for sure whether farming was significant enough to permit year round occupation of White Plains and, accordingly whether the deeds given to the white colonists were believed by the seller to provide the sellers with just a right to use the land (as suggested by other sales of the same land) rather than to procure exclusive ownership. In addition, the colonists' ethnocentric assumptions about political authority presumed that the Sachem, who signed the 1683 deed, had the authority to sell the land, but that also is not at all certain.

While acknowledging that this was a tragic chapter in the history of our non-European forbears, a few echoes of their lives here do remain. Of course there are archeological finds, reports of early European traders and settlers and linguistic data. But the most visible evidence for non-scholars are street and place names. Orawaupum, Nosband and Shapham are streets in White Plains named after local Sachems; and Kensico, which is the name of a number of White Plains streets (as well as the Kensico Reservoir and Kensico Dam) is the English spelling of Cockenseco, one of the signers of the 1683 deed. And In neighboring communities, native place names are also prevalent -- to name a few: Nepperhann was the pre-colonial name of the Saw Mill River meaning "cold running water"; Armonk, is a variation of the pre-colonial name for the Byram river; Croton, an adaptation of the name of a local Sachem, Knoten, and Mt. Kisco, an adaptation of Coaqmoea, the name of meadows just north of Mt. Kisco, the translation of which is "a muddy place."


## ARE WE READY FOR SPRING?




